LEGISLATIVE PRIORITIES



The Florida legislature began its annual session on Tuesday, March 4. While the Association is tracking a wide variety of issues that impact the forest community, below are summaries of our state legislative priorities:

SAVING MEMBERS MONEY

Sales Tax Exemptions

The Association has helped save our members hundreds of thousands of dollars through sales tax exemptions on power farm equipment, replacement parts, fencing, machinery, and more. This year, we are asking lawmakers to **expand the current sales tax exemption on trailers used by farmers to include trailers used in logging and forestry, too.**

Tangible Personal Property Taxes

Florida businesses pay taxes on physical property like equipment and supplies. Forestry and ag businesses do enjoy a small exemption, but they still pay high taxes. We are asking lawmakers to **increase their current exemption or remove the tax altogether**.

Tort Reform

The threat of frivolous lawsuits makes running a business more expensive and more difficult. They increase insurance costs, slow down job growth, and make it harder to predict business costs. We support tort reform efforts to **discourage abuse of our legal system.**

RECOVERING AFTER DISASTERS

State Hurricane Assistance

After Hurricane Idalia, Ag Commissioner Wilton Simpson worked with the legislature to create programs to help timber producers and farmers quickly get back on their feet. The Timber Disaster Assistance Program provided grants for cleaning up and replanting full timber stands damaged by the storm. We support the Commissioner's efforts to **make this program permanent and more flexible.** This would offer more help to landowners, including those with partially damaged stands.

OPENING NEW MARKETS

Mass Timber

Mass timber is a growing new building material that is strong, fire-resistant, and cost-effective. It's already allowed in other parts of the U.S. for construction but hasn't yet been approved for use in Florida. We support legislation directing the Florida Building Commission to include mass timber as an approved material in the state building code.

PROTECTING THE ENVIRONMENT

Critical Wetlands

Florida's new water laws require a database of wetlands to help with conservation. But some landowners with wetlands on their property are automatically added to this database and have to take steps to remove themselves. We are asking legislators to **give landowners the option to "opt in" to the database, instead of being forced to "opt out."**

Per- and Polyfluoroalkyl Substances (PFAS)

PFAS - also known as "forever chemicals" - are found in many everyday products. Some of these chemicals have been found in places like airports and military bases. While the state and federal governments are considering new rules for PFAS, there's still a lot of debate about how to regulate them. We support creating sensible and scientifically proven rules for PFAS, making sure they are practical and achievable.

MAKING IT EASIER TO DO BUSINESS

Farm TEAM Card

Florida now offers a special card for farmers, the Florida Farm Tax Exempt Agricultural Materials (TEAM) card. This card helps farmers skip paperwork and automatically get sales tax exemptions when buying farm materials. We support **creating a similar card for forestry businesses so they can easily access tax exemptions, too**.

Immigration Reform

Currently Florida requires businesses with 25 or more employees to use the federal E-verify system to confirm the eligibility of potential new hires. A bill has been filed this session that would expand that requirement to all

employers, regardless of the number of employees. We believe immigration issues should be handled at the federal level, not state by state.

STAYING VIGILANT

The sustainability of Florida forestry depends on existing laws protecting private property rights, the Greenbelt tax assessment, Right to Farm, and Ag Lands and Practices, among others. While advancing new legislation, we will also continue to **safeguard these foundational statutes.**

EUROPEAN UNION DEFORESTATION REGULATIONS (EUDR)



The EU Deforestation Regulation (EUDR) is a law from the European Union that aims to stop products linked to deforestation from being sold in Europe. It

affects goods like wood, beef, soy, palm oil, and rubber.

Even though EUDR is an EU law, it affects U.S. businesses that sell forest products to Europe. Companies must meet strict reporting and compliance rules or risk losing access to the EU market. If you export timber, paper, or other forest products to the EU, you must prove your products didn't come from deforested land after December 31, 2020. This requires detailed traceability, often using geolocation data, to show exactly where the wood was harvested. EUDR is currently scheduled to be enacted December 31, 2025.

EUDR presents several challenges to forestry throughout Florida and the United States. Commissioner Wilton Simpson invited the Florida Forestry Association and the Florida Farm Bureau to work with him in outlining the difficulties and proposing solutions. The end result was a letter signed by Commissioner Simpson and his counterparts in 18 states, urging U.S. Senators and members of the Trump Administration to address these concerns:

"We ask that you express strong opposition to the EUDR rule to protect private property rights, seek clarity and guidance on how land use conversion will be defined and enforced, advocate for exemptions for low risk designated countries with sustainability managed properties, including but not limited to incentivizing conservation practices and programs, and demand an economic impact analysis to evaluate how this regulation will affect agriculture globally."
