LEGISLATIVE WRAP-UP

On Monday, June 30, Governor Ron DeSantis signed the budget, with his associated line-item vetoes bringing closure to a clearly long and arguably contentious legislative session. It was just a few weeks ago when the Senate and House were

finally able to conference and pass a budget on day 105 of 60. While the session headlines focused on the "personalities" and different approaches to leadership demonstrated by the Governor, Senate President Ben Albritton and House Speaker Daniel Perez, it bears noting that the budget ultimately passed by the legislature was \$3.9 billion smaller (year over year) than the 2024-25 budget. That is certainly not an easy task, especially when the population continues to rise and the state's economy, albeit slower, is still healthy.

Adding to the reduction in spending, Governor DeSantis exercised his constitutional powers, trimming roughly \$1.3 billion (\$576 million in line-item vetoes) in additional dollars from the budget. Certainly, all of this translates into a couple of pretty clear themes:

- 1) Securing funding from the legislative process is getting extremely more competitive and, quite frankly, harder to secure, and
- 2) As we look towards proposals on broader sales tax reductions, as well as property tax relief and other proposals to lower residential property tax burdens, we may find ourselves in a spot where nonresidential property uses have to carry the water.

Notwithstanding the budget realities, on the whole, many of the programs and funding items which are important to Association members fared very well.

Florida Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services/ Florida Forest Service:

The proposed budget allocates \$250 million to the Rural and Family Lands Protection Program. A key priority for Commissioner Wilton Simpson, the forestry industry, and the ag industry at large, these funds allow for the less-than-fee purchase of agricultural properties to ensure those properties remain in production. The budget also allocates \$13.9 million for Florida Forest Service equipment with a priority placed on wildfire suppression equipment and updating the oldest equipment in the fleet.

In addition, the budget allocates \$28 million for land management activities and an additional \$4 million for reforestation efforts.

University of Florida/ Institute of Food and Agricultural Sciences (UF/IFAS):

The Association has always maintained a strong working partnership with our friends at UF/IFAS. We recognize and appreciate the critical roles teaching, research, and Extension play in the preservation and growth of our wood and wood products industry. This budget maintains the appropriation of \$1.1 million for the Forestry Education Program. The budget also allocates \$3.5 million to UF/IFAS workload, as well as \$2.5 million to the Center for Artificial Intelligence in Agriculture and \$5.6 million to update the 4-H Camp Cherry Lake facilities in Madison County.

Florida Department of Environmental Protection:

The legislature allocated \$50 million for springs and springs restoration projects. In addition, there is roughly \$18 million allocated for acquisition of environmentally sensitive lands and roughly \$51 million for the acquisition of three specific parcels of land, bringing the total investment in Florida Forever to roughly \$75 million.

During session we periodically updated members on myriad policy issues of interest to the industry. One such example is SB 700, an act relating to the Florida Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services, also known as the Florida Farm Bill. The Florida Farm Bill addresses multiple areas throughout the agriculture and consumer services parts of the department. Most notably, the bill, which has already been signed into law by Gov. DeSantis, contains statutory updates to the Timber Recovery Program as well as to the Agriculture/ Aquaculture Disaster Loan Program.

In addition, the legislation increases the private property rights protection from harassment by drones. Additionally, it eliminates Environmental, Sustainability and Governance (ESG) provisions from agricultural lending and provides critical language allowing for the construction of agricultural worker housing on agricultural lands.

The legislature also passed HB 1215, Ad Valorem Tax Exemptions. This legislation proposed an amendment to the Florida Constitution to exempt all agricultural lands from being subject to the Tangible Personal Property taxes (TPP). Having passed both the Senate and House by the required two-thirds vote, this language will now appear as a proposed Constitutional amendment on the 2026 general election ballot.

MYFLFOREST.LAND - FILMS FOR YOU, ABOUT YOU

It is great to be a forester in Florida, and it's great that we have the Florida Forestry Association that allows us to meet, exchange experiences, and learn new tricks. But what about the thousands of forest landowners and stakeholders

in the state that are not a part of our community yet? Where should they learn? How can we facilitate their growth as both stewards of the land and members of the forestry business community?

In Florida, there are an estimated 215,000 family forest ownerships that collectively own 4,020,000 acres. This large number of stakeholders is far beyond the reach of traditional networking and educational styles. How do we reach them?

The answer is: fun online films! While educational organizations are just beginning to use film as a medium for educating clients and members, film is of course a dominant element of the multi-billion-dollar entertainment industry. Because of the unique resonance with human senses and emotions, film offers the capacity to educate, change attitudes and induce action better than almost any other medium.

The Association has worked together with the University of Florida Forest Entomology lab (pitchtube. org), Southern Forestry Consultants (soforest.com), and a documentary film company Untamed Science (untamedscience.com) to produce a unique series of short documentary movies about you, and for you – the Florida forest landowners.

Watch and share the films! (myflforest.land)

Do you sometimes feel that your concerns and your joys are nowhere to be seen on the Internet? You are right. The goal of this project is to give Florida's forestry community a voice that is currently missing, using modern, fun, fast-paced media. More than entertainment, however, today's forestry community, particularly the younger members, have different learning preferences from past generations. In a survey, forest landowners in Florida indicated that attractive video is the most desirable educational delivery medium. That is new even to most university educators! The COVID-19 pandemic has shifted the delivery of educational content. Person-to-person

interactions such as workshops have become rare, and instead, many people are comfortable with information online. More than ever, educational resources need to be available online.

Creating the film content was not easy. Just selecting the topics was a triage. Forest landowners are navigating increasingly complex issues. New forest health threats, the volatile financial and regulatory landscape, and management objectives are all evolving. This is why, rather than relying on our own knowledge, we have enrolled experts from the University of Florida, the Florida Forest Service, and the vast ranks of the forest landowners themselves to share with us much of the specialized information in this series.

Associations, agencies and universities need to build online media infrastructure to stay relevant to their stakeholders. In this project, we hope that we are paving the way for widespread adoption of professional filmmaking, modern storytelling, and online delivery in our forestry community. We are grateful to the Florida Forest Service for supporting the project using funds from the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law.


You can play an important role: watch and share the films! Use them in your own outreach and educational efforts! This is ultimately what they are for.
