Legislators of the Year



Senator Wilton Simpson

"Senator Simpson has been a friend of Florida forestry for many years," said Association Executive Vice President Alan Shelby. Florida Logger of the Year Award: Dillon Stratton, III

"Winning this award seems to be a family tradition for the Stratton family," said Association President Jimmy Bielling. "Dillon's father earned the honor in 1995. We are proud to see the next generation taking its turn to achieve such a high degree of excellence."

Dillon's grandfather started the family logging company in 1958. From a young age, Dillon was working in the shop and on weekends alongside his father. When he became old enough, he started working on logging jobs. In 2013, he assumed leadership of the company. Together with his wife, Lisa, who runs the office, he has continued to grow the company many times over in a short period of time.

The Florida Logger of the Year Award recognizes loggers who demonstrate exemplary contributions and exceed industry expectations. The award was initiated in 1987 to spotlight loggers in the state who manage their operations in compliance with forestry best management practices, maintain safe highway and woods operations, use logging personnel and equipment effectively, develop unique business practices, and practice high business ethics.



Jon Gould Outstanding Tree Farmer of the Year Award: Albert Fuller

"Albert Fuller demonstrates the very best aspects of Tree Farmers," said Association President Jimmy Bielling. "He reaches out to other forestland owners to share his knowledge and experience, helping them to achieve the same success that he has. He is building a long-lasting

legacy that will benefit an untold multitude of people in many ways."

One of Albert's greatest joys is time spent on his 75-acre farm in Levy County, FL. His farm includes planted pines and natural stands of pines and hardwoods, as well as livestock, sugar cane and other crops. He maintains a balanced focus on timber production, recreation and wildlife for his Tree Farm, which takes up the majority of his land. Long term, he views his land as a legacy.

Before his retirement, Albert spent 42 years working in agriculture. Thirty-eight of those years were with the UF/IFAS Extension program.

Florida's Outstanding Tree Farmer of the Year Award honors the memory and legacy of Mr. Jon Gould, a respected member of Florida's Tree Farm Program State Committee and a proud Tree Farmer and advocate for forestry for more than 30 years throughout the Southeast.

GOPHER TORTOISE DETERMINATION



The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) has found that listing the gopher tortoise as a threatened or endangered species under the Endangered Species Act is not warranted in Florida.

The decision makes three determinations:

- Listing the gopher tortoise as threatened or endangered throughout its entire range is not warranted.
- The eastern and western portions of the gopher tortoise's range meet the criteria of Distinct Population Segments (DPS). An estimated 149,000 reported gopher tortoise individuals are distributed across their range with most found in the eastern segment and only 8 percent in the western segment.
- The eastern DPS which includes Florida, Georgia, South Carolina, and most of Alabama – does <u>not</u> require protection. The western DPS in Western Alabama, Mississippi, and Louisiana will retain its threatened status.

The USFWS is conducting a virtual public informational meeting Dec. 13, 2022, 7 – 9 p.m. EST to present the findings and address questions on gopher tortoise conservation and management. You can register for the meeting at fws.gov/project/gopher-tortoise

As this decision recognizes, private forest landowners play an important role, providing both habitat for the tortoise and information/data to the USFWS. Many thanks to all those whose time, effort and knowledge made this decision possible.

EMERGENCY ORDER LIFTING TRUCK WEIGHTS FOR HURRICANE IAN EXTENDED THROUGH NOVEMBER 22, 2022



Commissioner of Agriculture and Consumer Services Nikki Fried has authorized extending the suspension of truck weights for commercial trucks transporting forest products, agricultural commodities, emergency equipment or supplies under Governor Ron DeSantis's Executive Order 22-218 and 22-219.

Now valid through November 22, 2022, trucks may transport loads of timber up to 95,000 lbs. Each vehicle carrying this additional weight MUST carry a copy of the FDOT Emergency Road Use Permit letter and a TTT Bridge Restriction Map in the cab of the truck at all times or be able to access them electronically upon request.

The permit letter and applicable TTT map based on your configuration may be found on the FDOT website or by contacting the FDOT Permit Office at 850.410.5777.

We will keep you posted on any further developments.

The program, created in 1994, highlights environmentally innovative farming practices across different parts of Florida's agricultural industry.

The nominations for the award were evaluated by a committee of representatives from FDACS and key Florida agricultural groups. Award winners were judged on the following environmental practices:

- **Wildlife Protection and Habitat Conservation:** Provide a safe, viable habitat for wildlife within an agricultural operation.
- Pesticide/Nutrient Management: Use pesticides/nutrients responsibly, maximizing benefits and minimizing potential adverse environmental effects.
- Water Quality: Preserve or improve water quality within or adjacent to an agricultural operation.
- **Soil and Water Conservation:** Reduce soil erosion, nutrient depletion, and water consumption; and enhance water recharge.
- **Waste Management/Recycling:** Reduce waste by recycling agricultural byproducts and waste products on site.

"Lynetta's passion for forestry and agriculture shows in everything she does," said Association Executive Vice President Alan Shelby. "It's gratifying to see her recognized for the strides she has taken to lead forestry on all fronts."
