FIRE ASSESSMENT HIKE

In July, the Walton County Commission voted to assess property owners seven cents per acre for agricultural or vacant land. The money will be used to reimburse the county for funds it sends to the Florida Forest Service to fight brush fires in the area.

Because those funds come out of ad valorem taxes, some feel that the new assessment is double taxation. Others are concerned that it may be the start of a trend to use forestland as a new funding source for local governments.

FFA will continue to follow this issue.

FARM BILL PASSES CONGRESS

After a rapid turn of events, leadership in the House of Representatives split the traditional Farm Bill into two bills, first focusing on the farm-only provisions. This new legislation, H.R. 2642, passed the House in a 216-208 vote. Nutrition provisions will be dealt with separately.

This legislation offers several benefits to forest landowners:

- Protection from unnecessary permit requirements and regulations on forest roads;
- Access to new market opportunities for forest products, increasing available revenue to reinvest back into forest stewardship;
- Improved access to more conservation tools to improve wildlife habitat and forest stewardship; and
- Strengthened support for programs to fight invasive forest pests.

This bill moves the process a step forward, providing a path to conference committee with the Senate. It is hoped the result will be final, comprehensive Farm Bill legislation.

RURAL AND FAMILY LANDS PROGRAM APPLICATIONS

Florida Commissioner of Agriculture Adam Putnam encourages agricultural landowners to apply for the Rural and Family Lands Protection Program. The program was established to acquire perpetual agricultural conservation easements, ensuring lands will be preserved in agricultural use while providing for the protection of natural resources.

Development of Wildlife BMPs for Forestry Underway

A subcommittee of the Florida Department of Agriculture & Consumer Services' Silviculture Best Management Practices (BMP) Technical Advisory Committee met in Lake City on Thursday, July 18, to begin development of wildlife BMPs for forestry activities. The subcommittee, which includes FFA staff and members, representatives of key state and federal agencies and a representative from an environmental organization, made significant progress.

FFA 2013 ANNUAL MEETING: "Growing Through Change" September 3-5, 2013, in Ponte Vedra Beach

From September 3-5, meeting participants will be able to engage in exceptional educational, recreational and networking opportunities.

SPEAKERS

Our featured speakers include some of the best and brightest associated with our industry today:

Herschel Vinyard is the Secretary of the Florida Department of Environmental Protection (DEP). He will address DEP's priorities, mission and direction, sharing successes and opportunities in environmental protection partnerships.

The Secretary will also discuss the importance of the future of environmental land acquisition and management, and how all of this interacts with the future of Florida's working forests.

Jim Karels is the Director of the Florida Forest Service. He will share results from the Comprehensive Statewide Forest Inventory Analysis (CSFIA) project mandated by the 2012 Florida Energy Bill. The project used remote sensing techniques and the latest FIA data for its inventory and analytical approaches.

Karels will discuss availability of timber biomass resources statewide and locally, as well as forest sustainability index throughout the state.

Dr. Ann Shortelle is the Executive Director of the Suwannee River Water Management District (SRWMD). She will discuss recent trends in land use as evaluated within the context of water supply and water quality goals. She will also address the need for partnerships to stabilize protective land uses in key springsheds and other sensitive locations, along with mechanisms to encourage these partnerships.

Jon Steverson is the Executive Director of the Northwest Florida Water Management District (NWFWMD). He will share ideas on the importance of working forests in achieving the NWFWMD missions and goals; land conversion trends within the District; and opportunities to encourage or incentivize reforestation or afforestation.

Hans Tanzler is the Executive Director of the St. Johns River Water Management District (SJRWMD). He will speak about SJRWMD activities of interest to the forestry community, including the District's land management activities, the year-long lands assessment and other issues.

Jeff Vowell of the Florida Forest Service, **Scott Sanders** of the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission, and **Doug Rillstone** of Broad & Cassel will provide an update on the development of wildlife best management practices for forestry.

Al Morales is the Chief Financial Officer of American Renewables, the developer of the Gainesville Renewable Energy Center (GREC). The GREC is a 100 megawatt power generation facility fueled by woody biomass, scheduled to open in the fall. When operational, GREC will use approximately one million green tons of clean wood waste per year.

Topics to be covered will include an overview of the facility and its operations; fuel requirements and types; and fuel sustainability standards.
